AGAINST CHILD ABUSE \$32,000

Promoting a caring and non-violent environment for the optimal growth and development of children.

Project: Cultivate a harmonious family in which parents and children relate well and can talk about sex related topics.

AIDS CONCERN \$21,000

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Keep HIV prevalence in Hong Kong low through targeted prevention and care programs for vulnerable communities, and to reduce the stigma attached to the disease and the communities most affected.

Project: Provide comprehensive sexual health education to at-risk young females through small groups/ in-depth workshops.

AUTISM PARTNERSHIP \$21,181

(Funded by American Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation)

Private primary school, specially catered for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder

Project: Provide basic US Scholastic learning material.

BETHUNE HOUSE \$28,000

(Partially funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign - \$14,000)

Helps migrant workers in Hong Kong.

Project: Refurbish kitchen to feed migrant workers in transition.

CHAI WAN BAPTIST CHURCH \$155,000

Serves the underprivileged and needy patients with passion and love in the arena of Health care in the community.

Project: To reduce the incidents of osteoporosis of women in the Chai Wan District.

CHANGING YOUNG LIVES \$28,536

Children and Youth Learning Centre which provides free activities to support underprivileged families.

Project: Support for 30 underprivileged mothers to increase their self-esteem through improved work skills and broadened social network.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE \$16,420

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Providing early intervention program for children with special educational needs and act as a resource to empower parents and service providers through counseling and outreach programs.

Project: Cognitive and intellectual assessment for children with special needs.

EBENEZER SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND \$11,180

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Day and residential school for children with multiple physical disabilities including blindness.

Project: Enhancement of project-based learning for students with visual impairment.

ENLIGHTEN \$1,000

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Provides support, care and education regarding epilepsy.

Project: Create a performance to inspire others to be more accepting of people with epilepsy in the local community.

ENRICH \$40,000

Provides practical training on financial literacy and confidence building to women.

Project: Training/mentoring for migrant workers to prepare them to return to their country.

FAMILIES OF SMA CHARITABLE TRUST \$42,960

(Funded by American Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation)

Cares for patients who need very specialized care and would die if left to wait for government intervention and subsidy.

Project: Emergency Home Help to assist a disabled patient with Spinal Muscular Atrophy.

HELPING HAND \$27,850

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Residential care for the elderly in Hong Kong.

Project funding to benefit residents of Sin Sai Wan and Po Lan Housing for Elderly.

HK BREASTFEEDING MOTHERS' ASSOCIATION \$35,000

Provides education and personal help via breast feeding ambassadors, sharing sessions and programs to show how easy and beneficial breastfeeding can be.

Project: Develop the first Chinese language phone app to help new breastfeeding mothers.

HK DOWN SYNDROME ASSOCIATION \$104,977.20

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Serves individuals with Down syndrome, the disabled, people with intellectual disabilities and their family members with family support and vocational rehabilitation services.

Project: Support 8 swimmers with Down Syndrome to participate in the DSISO World Championships in Loano, Italy.

HK PHAB ASSOCIATION \$30,000

Promotes social integration of people with and without disabilities by their participation in social, recreational, developmental and educational activities.

Project: Art therapy group for female carers of people with physical or mental disabilities.

HK SOCIETY FOR THE AGED

ABERDEEN \$40,000 (Funded by American Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation)

Residential care home for the elderly.

Project: Purchase of two vital sign monitors to enable the monitoring of frail and ill elderly patients.

NORTH POINT \$25,000

Day Care facility for the elderly.

Project: Purchase of three APT machines in order to promote passive limb mobilization of frail elderly.

JOYFUL (MENTAL HEALTH) FOUNDATION \$7,260

Provides services for people who suffer from mood disorder and their caregivers, enhances social awareness about mental health and minimizes misunderstanding and discrimination against mood disorder in the community.

Project: Teach participants how to achieve a better mental status through a multi-dimensional approach.

KELY \$50,000

Bilingual organization which provides non-judgmental, empathetic and confidential support to youths between the ages of 14 to 24.

Project: Suicide prevention targeting local Chinese female students.

LIONS KIDNEY \$131,818

(Partially funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign - \$2,340)

Devoted to educate the public in preventing kidney disease through health promotions and to provide low-cost Hemodialysis services for kidney patients with financial difficulties.

Project: Replacement of Hemodialysis machine.

NESBITT CENTRE \$19,200

(Funded by American Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation)

Enables adults with special needs the opportunity to maximize their life potential.

Project: The development and delivery of a specialist health promotion program for English speaking women with learning disabilities.

Non-profit general medical dental and eye clinic for the poor in Hong Kong.

PE Link and Elder Ring Hotline Service to enhance the quality of living of the elderly in the community through the use of technology, people-oriented services and innovative methods.

Project: Free 24-hour mobile Link Service for 30 elderly and people in need that are in financial difficulties for 1 year.

SISTERS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD \$10,450

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Promotes the welfare of women and girls with a focus on the marginalized, disadvantaged, abused and most at risk.

Project: Adventure boat activity.

SUEN MEI SPEECH AND HEARING CENTRE \$37,800

Provide early education and training for hearing impaired children with the goal of integrating them into main stream education systems.

Project: Remedial educational support for 2 hearing impaired students.

SUNSHINE ACTION \$17,005

(Funded through AWA Designated Giving Campaign)

Main charitable mission to 'feed the hungry and embrace the unloved'. Since its establishment it contributed to 200 organizations in Hong Kong and around the World by providing rice, packed food, stationeries, medicines, daily products toiletries etc.

Project: Provide bags of food to those who can no longer receive Government benefits and are hungry and needy.
