Promoting a caring and non-violent environment for the optimal growth and development of children.

Project: Educating children on sexual knowledge and facilitating parents to implement family sex education.

THE SPRINGBOARD PROJECT \$6,538

(Funded by American Chamber of Commerce Charitable Foundation)

Nurture, educate and empower young people with special educational needs.

Project: Purchase of items for their speech therapy programme.

HK JUVENILE DIABETES ASSOCIATION \$7,600

Support children and adolescents with diabetes and their families in Hong Kong

Project: Educational activities and support for children with diabetes and their families to live and happier and healthy life

RAPHA FOUNDATION \$28,200

Helping individuals with financial difficulties that require support and professional counselling/psychotherapy.

Project: Adventure based training programme for youths who receive service at the hostel.

SUNSHINE ACTION \$50,000

Main charitable mission to feed the hungry and embrace the unloved. Since its establishment it contributed to 200 organizations in Hong Kong and around the World by providing rice, packed food, stationeries, medicines, daily products toiletries etc.

Project: Provide bags of staple food products during Christmas and New Year 2013 to supplement food provision to these families.

Project: To support people with dementia with financial difficulties through use of specialised day care services.
