

AWA CHARITABLE DONATIONS AND EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH 2010

Against Child Abuse \$40,000

Workshop for parents and teens entitled, "Can We Talk - Sex" designed to educate parents and empower kids to protect themselves against sexual abuse and harassment.

Association for Engineering and Medical Volunteer Services \$12,225

Technical and computer aids for the disabled, including a Super-talker, combo board and SCATIR (Self-Calibrating Auditory Tone Infrared) switch used for rehabilitation training services in the Special Computer Aids Library. Five hundred people will benefit from this service in rehabilitation institutions and settings.

Changing Young Lives Foundation \$21,400 AWA plus \$25,000 AmCham Charitable Foundation

Workshops in aid of 40 underprivileged/impoverished mothers in need of post-natal support (depression/emotional problems/infant care/nourishment) that will also benefit their children under age five. Includes post-natal care supplies and offers support to undereducated residents and immigrants.

Cheshire Home Shatin \$28,500

Residential care home for the chronically ill and permanently disabled who are without means or of limited resources. Grant includes purchasing ten sets of Roho Cushions – pressure relief cushions for bedridden patients.

Cheung Chau Sacred Heart School \$10,000 AmCham Charitable Foundation

Many of the students at this school come from families of meager incomes. The school will purchase English language books for primary grade students.

Child Development Center \$10,310 AmCham Charitable Foundation

Replacement of old headsets, new modified CD's and player for therapeutic listening program. Forty three special needs students (autistic, developmentally delayed and those with physical/mental disabilities) will benefit from this equipment.

Ebenezer School \$38,000

Ebenezer cares for and educates disabled and visually impaired children. They require a shower trolley that will provide female boarders access to rehabilitation and a safe bathing environment.

End Child Sexual Abuse \$16,500

Funds will be used to produce educational booklets to supplement a workshop program.

Enlighten Action for Epilepsy Hong Kong \$33,500

Provide outings for people with epilepsy; increase self-esteem and networking; enhance understanding and quality of life. Children will benefit from a dolphin watch and a Christmas party.

Enrich \$39,950

Enrich works with many problems affecting migrant workers in Hong Kong. They explore financial/savings issues and the complex demands placed on helpers by their families back home. Funding also for Sunday Street Theatre.

Haven of Hope \$35,550

Enhance holistic wellbeing of females recently arrived from mainland China. Includes health education, check ups (pap smears) and socialization. Funding of a one-year project includes psychological, physical and social activities such as talks, discussion groups, and lectures.

Helping Hand \$20,347

One oximeter (measures blood oxygen levels), one easy riser sling and five replacement refrigerators for Siu Sai Wan housing for the elderly as they serve 750 elderly throughout Hong Kong.

HK Breast Feeding Mothers Association \$34,400

To develop and distribute a DVD to show on buses and to individual mothers to encourage, support and highlight the benefits of breastfeeding. In addition, to sponsor a collective breastfeeding information event for "World Breastfeeding Week."

HK Juvenile Diabetes Association \$24,000

The Association educates families with diabetic children. Funding is for a seminar program and counselor for families to help develop peer groups and to encourage healthy habits with youth/teen diabetics. About 200 children require support and encouragement because of the stigma attached to this relatively unknown disease, especially in the Hong Kong schools.

HK PHAB \$40,000

Let the Music Continue to Play! This music therapy program for 160 mothers of children with disabilities is also a support group for these parents suffering from depression. Disabled children are cared for while mothers learn coping and stress relief skills.

HK Society for the Aged \$29,805 (Anti-wandering) \$16,470 (Shower aid)

The anti-wandering device prevents people with dementia from straying out of the dorm; this would cover a women’s dorm. The shower aid is a special wheeled mobile shower chair.

Kely \$11,000

Program to educate girls and help reinforce positive body image in the wake of negative media attention and pressure for “pseudo models” and compensated dating. Target local Chinese schools; connect women in the government and media, educators and leading experts to young adults in an intensive media training camp for 60 students, who will then be encouraged to teach their peers.

Project Concern \$24,000

Six units of dental tools for four dental clinics and two mobile vans; this will replace 11-year old equipment. Services the poor, disabled and elderly.

Rainlily: Association Concerning Sexual Violence Against Women \$30,000

Purchase rape crisis management kits (including evidence kits, pregnancy test kits, scar management kits, and shower packs) for the recently opened rape crisis center in United Christian Hospital.

Senior Citizen Home Safety Assn. \$75,000

Twenty-four hour PE link service for elderly who do not qualify for government emergency alarm systems.

Springboard Project \$6,668 AmCham Charitable Foundation

Reading materials for special need young adults. Teens require specialized English language books, not available in Hong Kong, to teach them at a level they can understand.

Suen Mei Speech and Hearing Center \$13,300 AmCham Charitable Foundation

Five hearing aids for profoundly deaf children under age six.

Youth Outreach \$51,504

Provide crisis intervention to marginal adolescents. Program is “Anti-Drugs Express” designed to get kids off the streets during the vulnerable nighttime hours. Counselors and outreach workers will engage the youths in interesting and entertaining activities to turn them away from drugs.
